# SCOUT CLASSES: WILDERNESS SURVIVAL

WILDERNESS SURVIVAL:

JUNIOR GIRL SCOUTS & WEBELOS SCOUTS

Wilderness Survival will introduce scouts to the two most important skills needed to stay alive in the wilderness. Scouts will build a full-size shelter and learn how to make a good fire. This class will show scouts how to see the wilderness as safe and fun. This three-hour class is designed for scouts age 7 and up, and it usually runs from 4-7PM, Mon - Sat. Parents are welcome to come along at no additional charge! Cost: \$170 per group, max 10 scouts.

BOW DRILL AND HAND DRILL CLASS

This class is for scouts who have "graduated" from our Wilderness Survival Class. Scouts learn how to make fire using ancient, time tested tools. They learn what plants the Tongva and Acjachemen used to make bow and hand drills. Mark demonstrates how these tools work, and shows the scouts how they can make them at home, with or without using a knife. Scouts practice using each of the tools, and with Mark's assistance the scouts light a fire using one of the tools. Fire safety and responsibility are highlighted throughout class. This three-hour class is designed for scouts age 8 and up, and it usually runs from 4-7PM, Mon - Sat. Parents are welcome to come along at no additional charge! Cost: \$200 for maximum 10 scouts.

TEACHER: MARK HAY

Mark has studied native cultures for more than twelve years, starting as a History major at the University of Redlands and most recently as an instructor with the Environmental Nature Center and Earthroots Field School. Mark believes that by studying the ancient survival skills of our human ancestors, we can form a stronger connection to the Earth and to one another. Mark has attended many wilderness survival programs, including classes at the Tracker School and at the Wilderness Awareness School founded by Jon Young.
