

Education Intern JOB DESCRIPTION

Definition

The Education Intern works in conjunction with the Leads and Naturalists to ensure that students experience quality education through hands-on experience with nature.

Supervision

The education intern works under the direct supervision of the Lead Naturalist.

Essential Functions/Duties Include, But Are Not Limited To:

- 1. Aid in special projects in and around the nature center.
- 2. Set-up, take-down, and staff outreach booths at various off-site events, professionally representing the ENC to the public.
- 3. Maintain Traveling Naturalist and on-site program supplies; inform appropriate coordinator of supplies needing replacement or repairs.
- 4. Arrive when scheduled to prepare and set-up for programs, being mindful of travel time.
- 5. Supervise students at all times for the duration of programs, extending to the release of students to their guardians. Maintain the highest possible degree of safety.
- 6. Maintain positive communication with all program participants as well as all visitors to the nature center.
- 7. Responsible for notifying the Grounds Manager of any safety hazards (i.e. fallen trees), and for closing any trail if necessary.
- 8. Staff the front desk when requested a minimum of one weekend day per month. Staff the ENC occasionally in the evenings and for mandatory special events (i.e. Fall Faire, Spring Faire, Taste of Twilight, Summer Soiree).
- 9. Assist in the care of our program animal collection, assuring that all of the animals' needs are met for the duration of their off-site visits; report any issues or concerns with the program animals to the Education Specialist.
- 10. Additional duties as assigned.

Qualifications & Requirements

- 1. Commitment to the mission, vision, and core values of the ENC.
- 2. Ability to work independently with minimal supervision and demonstrate flexibility.
- 3. Ability or willingness to handle a variety of animals including amphibians, mammals, arthropods, and reptiles.
- 4. Ability to memorize and recall facts, figures, and information.
- 5. Ability to move up to fifty pounds and set up equipment.
- 6. Ability to hike on trails, and traverse stairs and uneven terrain while carrying equipment.
- 7. Ability to make independent decisions and respond to immediate needs of students, emergency situations, and program needs.
- 8. Ability to work outside in a variety of weather conditions and temperatures.
- 9. Regular, reliable and punctual attendance is essential because of limited resources, costs, productivity, and quality continuity.

- 10. Ability to work irregular hours, including occasional weekends and evenings.
- 11. Ability to interact successfully with supervisors, staff, teachers, parents, and students.
- 12. Fingerprinting will be required at the individual's cost.
- 13. Computer (Macintosh and Microsoft Office) experience required or willingness to learn.
- 14. Must possess a valid driver's license and preferably a personal vehicle.

Skill to:

- 1. Instruct and supervise children in an indoor setting.
- 2. Communicate effectively in the English language, in both oral and written forms.
- 3. Create and maintain strong cooperative relationships with school staff and volunteers.
- 4. Understand and carry out oral and written instructions in an independent manner.
- 5. Understand and apply pertinent personnel policies, laws, rules, and regulations.

Education, Training, and Experience:

- 1. Demonstrate an understanding, patient, and receptive attitude toward students of varied age groups, including adults in small as well as large group activities.
- 2. Current CPR and First Aid Certificates are required within two months of employment.
